

Ease I just finished reading *The Descent of Man and Selection in Relation to Sex* (1871) by C. Darwin. The e-book is a real treat, because it's complete, only 10,000 words long and well-edited and with nearly 600 illustrations! Although we've talked in this forum about many of his essays, his first, *The Expression of the Emotions in Man and Animals* (1872) is still undervalued. Not only that, it's the only full scale book on what I consider to be one of Darwin's greatest books. Darwin is one of my favorite writers, but here's what I noticed while reading *The Descent of Man and Selection in Relation to Sex*: Although they have become more and more domesticated (or selected, depending on your viewpoint) and this is important in nature (where no domestic dog would live), the changes that have taken place, which are evident in nearly all domesticated dogs, are extremely mild compared to the change that has been wrought in humans! Why is that? Animals have been changed and sometimes through selective breeding become more tame. In the process of becoming domesticated, the change in human form has been much less drastic, possibly even practically invisible to most. I'm talking about the changes that occurred in humans, such as the flattening of the face and increasing distance between the eyes, the shrinking of the skull, the sharpening of the jaws and teeth, the thickening and shortening of the fingers and toes. For example, the average height of a modern Eskimo is approximately 5'6", but that's not as small as most modern Native American Indians (5'10") or American Blacks (6'0"). It's also interesting to notice how the skull was strengthened as a result of selective breeding. Yet the modern Eskimo still looks like an ape, whereas the modern Native American Indians have become "more Indian" than "less Indian", even if they were born of a Native American mother and father, who had parents that were not modern Indians.
